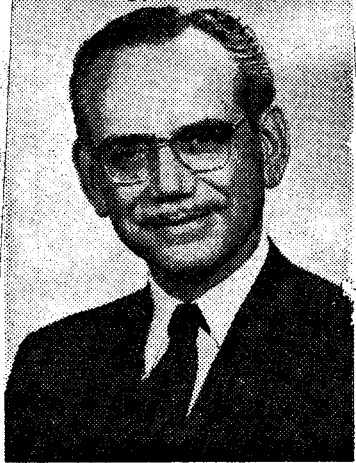

Councilman James Harvey Brown, 13th District, first took office in May, 1959 to fill out the unexpired term of Ernest E. Debs, who had been elected a Los Angeles County Supervisor.

Councilman Brown, was re-elected to his councilmanic seat in the primary election, April 4, 1961.

A practicing attorney in Hollywood for 15 years, Brown is also a registered professional electrical engineer in this state. He spent 20 years as an engineer with radio stations and as engineering supervisor with NBC.

Brown attended schools in California and holds an LLB from Southwestern University.

A member of such clubs as the Al Malaikah Shrine, American Legion, and Veterans of Foreign Wars, he belongs to the Los Angeles, Hollywood, and Federal Communications bar associations.

In the last election, Brown had strong labor support, including that of the AFL-CIO Committee on Political Education.
