



Sylvan bike trail

An 800-foot section of a planned bike path has already been completed adjacent to the flood control channel south of the Avenue 49 footbridge. The completed trail will be two miles long, reaching from Montecito Heights Park to Arroyo Seco Park near the York Blvd. bridge. A portion of the trail will be in the flood control channel.

A bike trail path is being cut into the sides of the Arroyo Seco Flood control channel at the Avenue 49 footbridge, part of a \$750,000 project by the city which will be completed in early October. The two-mile long bike path begins at Montecito Heights Park and will end at the Arroyo Seco Park near the York Blvd. bridge. Barriers will prevent motorcycles from using the path and gates will block access to the channel on rainy days.



Arroyo Seco Bikeway

Currently in the planning stage is a 10 foot wide concrete bikeway and six foot chainlink fence extending from Ave. 43 to Ave. 52 which is part of the "backbone system" of the proposed Bicycle Element of the city's general plan. Most of the facility will be separated from motor vehicle traffic. Eventually, the bikeway will serve as part of a bicycle transportation cor-

ridor from the adjacent communities to the central business district. The facility will serve several parks and Heritage Square. The design will be completed next year but there is no planned date for construction. Cost of the Avenue 43 to Avenue 52 section is estimated at \$197,986.
