THE HIGHLAND PARK COUNCIL DISTRICT

Located to the north of the central business section, this district varies in character from an industrial area in the south to a residential community in the central and northern portions. It is not a single community. In fact, due to topographical features such as Mount Washington and the Arroyo Seco, it is actually divided into four areas differing widely in economic and social conditions.

It is a most interesting fact, however, that there is a close correspondence between the presence of the recognized forces that tend to community degeneration, and the presence of high delinquency rates.

The southern area is marked by the presence of a number of industrial establishments employing the lowest grade of labor, and housing conditions around these plants are poor.

The average economic level is low but fairly uniform, and while incomes are small, employment is rather steady. The result is a delinquency area with a low but steady rate and one that shows no indications of a probable large increase.

Two other areas, one lying to the east of Mount Washington, the other on the slopes of the mountain, are residential districts, generally rather low in the economic scale and somewhat difficult to reach with any program. These conditions are resulting in a slow but very steady increase in delinquency rates in the ravines running up from Figueroa Street and deserve attention.

It is in the northern sector where the greater part of the population is concentrated and where the delinquency problem is most serious. It should be noted, however, that this problem is only a relative one.

The general delinquency rate of the area is below the city average and has decreased every year and in regard to the district as a whole should continue under control.

In this northern sector, however, there are definite forces in action - forces not brought into being by the wish or through any fault of the citizens of the community, but by the natural growth of the city.

Some of these forces are the results of changes in population characteristics.

This area was originally a suburban community developed by a type of residents who wished to secure for themselves and for their children, better and cleaner surroundings than they could find in the city. It developed as a community noted for its high moral tone and for its religious activities. This is reflected in the large number of churches, there being at this time 38 in a district with a population of 56,730 people.

The natural growth of the city has, however, destroyed the isolation that alone makes the existence of a community of this type possible. Opportunity in other sections has resulted in younger people as they marry, moving elsewhere and, as the marginal areas in the Arroyo and the hills have been developed, a new class interested primarily in low rentals and low living costs has entered the district. It is fast becoming the numerically strongest element in the population.

These newcomers have not been brought into the general life of the community, in fact, there is a certain antagonistic feeling on the part of the original residents, and the antagonism perhaps intensified by the fact that the new population group has a much larger proportion of young people.

All these are disintegrating influences. They all tend to destroy that respect for the good opinion of one's neighbor that is one of the great cohesive forces in our social system.

The Highland Park Council has recognized this condition and there has been some exceptionally fine work done, especially in the area around York Blvd. and Figueroa Street.

The conditions themselves are still active, however, and it will only be through continued effort on the part of the Council that the high-powered character of the district can be maintained.

Community integration through community cooperation, parent education of the type that deals with mental and ethical, rather than with the physical factors, juvenile group organization and juvenile group leadership, are very plainly indicated. These can set up opposing, constructive forces that can combat and to a great extent nullify the destructive ones with a new and more stable community life as the result.

Review of the Past Year

The emphasis during the year 1937-38 was on activities rather than meetings. To this end the program for the year included very few outside speakers. Each regular meeting was composed of two parts. The first three-quarters of an hour was given over to committee meetings. Following that the entire group met, listened to reports of committees and their recommendations, and decided upon policies and programs of activities.

The balance of this report consists of a summary of the activities and accomplishments of the Council during the year.

Attempts were made to gain the cooperation of Lincoln Heights, Eagle Rock, and Highland Park districts in order to secure a Y.M.C.A. Branch for our district. A meeting was called at which representatives of the Coordinating Councils, service clubs, and high schools of the three communities met with a representative of the Community Chest.

The Environment Committee made a study of community dances with the view to extending this form of entertainment for our young people.

More adequate adult supervision of dances at the playground was obtained through the member organizations.

Two panel discussions were held on community problems, one at the high school and another at an elementary school.

An unsuccessful attempt was made to secure bus service for junior and senior high school pupils in the Mt. Washington area.

The Annandale School Fathers' Forum was supported by letter and resolution in requesting the playground department to furnish playground facilities for older boys and girls in the Annandale section.

A survey was made of the number, variety, and location of liquor establishments in the community. The information was given to various member organizations, and they were urged to report liquor violations to the Board of Equalization. Attempts were made to stop the increase in number of liquor licenses issued in the community.

A large beer parlor and public dance hall had been planned to be established adjacent to the Highland Park Playground, through the activities of the Coordinating Council. This was forestalled.

Petitions were circulated through member organizations for placing on ballot, measures for more adequate control of liquor traffic.

The Environment Committee made it possible for the Community Nursery School to keep going by giving benefits and securing from member organizations donations for current expenses (approximately \$40 per month).

A survey was made of places selling salacious literature, and each place requested to stop such sales. Practically 100 per cent cooperation was obtained.

Member organizations were urged to use their influence in exerting pressure upon merchants to cease their illegal selling of cigarettes to minors.

Information was given to members regarding the Federal Housing and Slum Clearance Act.

The Environment Committee investigated traffic hazards at York Boulevard and Aldama Street. They made a report to the traffic department with the result that signals were installed there and consequently traffic hazards were decreased.

At Christmas time the Adjustment Committee cleared Christmas baskets for various organizations in the community, and the Council made arrangements for taking 78 needy children to the Christmas party given by the Lancers.

Some of the members of the Council took a course for Vacation Bible School workers held at the Philharmonic Auditorium.

Arrangements were made for 35 boys and 20 girls to attend Valyermo Summer Camp, sponsored by the Police Department.

The School Board was petitioned to keep open certain playgrounds during the vacation period, and the request was granted.

During the year underprivileged children of the community were taken on several trips. Six trips were taken to ball games at Wrigley Field on Saturday afternoon with an average of 20 on each trip. Three excursions were made to the Los Angeles Zoo with an average of 25 per trip. Two trips were made to the Museum of Arts and Sciences and the industrial exhibits at Exposition Park with about 30 in each group. Twenty children were taken to the Griffith Park Planetarium. Fifteen were taken to the Southwest Museum. Thirty-four youngsters were taken to the performance of "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs" at John H. Francis Polytechnic High School. Twenty-five boys were taken to the Loyola-Santa Clara football game at the Coliseum. Fifty-four boys and girls were taken to the Greek Theatre to see "Hansel and Gretel." Thirty were taken to visit the County Fair at Pomona.

During the summer vacation period, 12 Vacation Church Schools were conducted with an enrollment of over 1000 and a daily attendance of over 750.

PREVIEW OF THE COMING YEAR

The coming year will bring new officers, preferably leaders in the community, who will command larger followings and draw a greater attendance, which has decreased towards the end of the year.

Meetings have been changed from the third Monday to the third Wednesday. This will allow more P.-T.A. members, school principals and church leaders to attend, who otherwise could not be present.

Efforts to help underprivileged boys and girls attend camps and Vacation Church Schools, and enjoy playground activities will be stressed this summer. The Community Halloween Program is a big event in which many Highland Park organizations and merchants always assist.

Efforts to provide places and clubs for the pre-delinquent, or minor offenders will continue. Well chaperoned young peoples' dances is a need which may be fulfilled this fall.
