CITIZENS GIVE LIBRARY SITE.

GARVANZA TO HAVE HANDSOME CARNEGIE BRANCH.

Deed Is Presented to Board by
Committee—Site Overlooks the
Arroyo Seco and Is Adjacent to
Future Great Park System—Train-
ing Class Problems.

The Garvanza Improvement Association, by its committee composed of Dr. J. L. Smith, president; W. M. Miller, vice-president, and Ernest Braunton, presented the Library Board last evening with the deed to property at Piedmont and Pasadena avenues to be used for one of the six Carnegie branch libraries.

The offer is unique by reason of the fact that the association raised every dollar of the \$5680 required for the purchase by subscription, and because it is the first site to be given the board by citizens of a library district free of all encumbrance. The association has been working eight months on the project.

The site is a triangle 360x135x290 feet, affording unusual opportunity for architectural embellishment, and overlooking the Arroyo Seco half way between Highland Park and Garvanza where a great park system is some day to be established.

It is the purpose of the board to proceed with the building as soon as possible. This will be the second of the libraries to be begun, the first at Vermont Square being already under way. A tentative plan was presented by Architect F. M. Ashley, associated with Train & Williams. The Carnegie appropriation is \$210,000, or \$35,000 for each building.

The balance of the session was passed by the board in the transaction of routine business and a discussion of the training class problem which is giving Miss Anna Beckley, chief of the reference department, and lecturer, considerable concern.

Miss Beckley argues for abolishment of the class on the grounds that the students attracted are in many instances not fitted for library work and the time spent in their instruction is wasted.

Miss Helen Kennedy, branch librarian and superintendent of training, wants to expand the work and establish here a full-fledged library school modeled after some of the famous eastern institutions of this character.

Such a school, in her opinion, will attract students from all parts of the Southwest and put the local library in the lead in this work. Under the present arrangement it is necessary to send to the East for trained librarians. The board took the subject under further advisement.
