JOHN C. FREMONT BRANCH LIBRARY

<u>History</u>

The John C. Fremont Branch Library history began in 1912 when Colegrove Station reading room was opened at Vine Street and Santa Monica

Boulevard by a group of public-spirited citizens.

Designated a sub-branch of the Hollywood Branch Library in 1916, the reading room moved to a bungalow in 1923 erected on the grounds of the Vine Street School. That year voters approved a bond measure for the construction of new library branches, including a permanent home for the bungalow, then known as the Santa Monica Boulevard Branch Library.

In 1925, the bungalow was moved to the corner of Melrose Avenue and Seward Street in anticipation of the construction of a new permanent branch at the northeast corner of Melrose Avenue and June Street. The Board of Library Commissioners that year also voted to change the branch's name to the John C. Fremont Branch to honor the noted American explorer, soldier and politician. Fremont, known by the nickname "Trailblazer," had played a major role in the 1846 "Bear Flag" Revolt and in the American conquest of California.

Construction of the new branch began on December 26, 1926, and was completed in May of 1927. It opened June 1 with no chairs or tables for the first week. This did not deter patrons, however, who leaned against book

shelves or just sat on the floor to read.

The charming building, which has been described as early Italian with a touch of Spanish, has since earned a position on the National Register of Historic Places and has been designated a Historic Cultural Monument of the

City of Los Angeles.

In 1990, the building was closed in compliance with the Los Angeles City Building and Safety Commission's earthquake hazard reduction order. Its masonry was unreinforced and did not meet seismic safety codes. Temporary quarters were set up at 736 N. La Brea Avenue, from which location the library operated until February 17, 1996. With restoration of the historic building almost complete, the library staff, along with volunteers from the community, began moving books and readying the building for opening day.

The John C. Fremont Branch's historic building was reinforced and renovated as part of the Library's Branch Library Building Project, made possible by the passage of Proposition #1, the 1989 Library Bond Issue. The branch has been enlarged and modernized. A multi-purpose room has been added which will provide the community a meeting place. A much needed parking lot has been provided. M2A, Barry Milofsky and Thomas Michali, Architects, designed the renovated facility, which is air-conditioned and accessible to the physically challenged. The building has increased electrical capacity to accommodate modern library technology, such as LAPL's new automated circulation system and computerized catalogue, which provides information about books available within the entire Los Angeles Public Library system. These renovations bring the building up to code and ensure that the facility has the capabilities to meet the demands of a new century.

An outdoor courtyard has been added, with the sculptures entitled "Big Ideas" by artist Barbara Field. These free-standing sculptures and functional elements are large punctuation marks made of glazed and handmade tiles, some of which were designed by neighborhood school children. The art includes a question mark, an exclamation mark and parentheses which align with the curved entrances of the building and echo both the old and the new architecture.

The John C. Fremont Branch Library is located in the Fourth Council District represented by John Ferraro.


