ANECDOTES AND PERSONAL IMPRESSIONS:

An automobile pioneer, James Simpson Conwell built the first Waverly Electric car back in 1899.

Mr. Conwell early in life believed the automobile to be the transportation of the future. He was actively connected with all phases of the automotive industry, through manufacture, display, sale, and financing.

A man of distinguished appearance and gracious manners, and possessing a reputation for sane actions on all questions, he was the sole member of the 1915 Council to be reelected. As manager of the Automobile Show he was instrumental in making it a great annual success.
