George Barkman Cronk, Councilman, 5th District

Voters of the fifth councilmanic district have chosen George Parkman Cronk as their representative in city affairs.

Born at Omaha, Nebraska, January 19, 1904, Councilman Cronk has been in the insurance business since 1924, and is presently owner of the George P. Cronk and company brokerage firm at 5410 Wilshire boulevard.

Like Councilman George H. Moore, Cronk's family dates back to the American Revolution in which a distant relative serve as a lieutenant colonel.

Prior to his election to the City Council in 1945, he served from 1939 to 1942 on the Manhattan Beach Board of Education. During the war he was vice-chairman of the Wilshire district War Chest and the Wilshire district U.S.O. He also contributed to the war effort as an instructor at North American Aviation.

Councilman Cronk is a member of the Kiwanis club, Trojan club, Sons of the Revolution, Los Angeles Athletic Club, Lakeside Country club and the James A. Garfield Masonic lodge.
