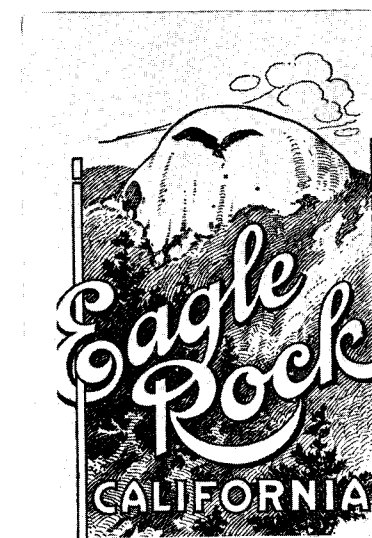

(There was no Occidental student named Rob Yorke).
