

## Nominated as monument

The Yoakum house at 140 S. Avenue 59 has passed the second step for approval as a city historical-cultural monument, by winning the backing of the recreation, library and cultural affairs committee. Last step needed is approval by the City Council. The Tudor Revival house, which dates from 1915, was previously certified as a monument by the Cultural Heritage Board, on the nomination of Highland Park Heritage Trust. It was built for Father Finis Ewing Yoakum, founder of the Pisgah religious movement, and was restored by present owners Bruce and Barbara Simpson, who bought the house in 1976.
